

From Screen to Sanctuary: Dolores Hart made her Hollywood debut as a teenage actress in the 1957 film Loving You, sharing a kiss with Elvis Presley. Her promising career continued with nine more films. However, her path took an unexpected turn in 1964 while portraying St. Clare in Francis of Assisi. During a meeting with Pope John XXIII, she explained her role to him. The Pope responded, "No, you are Clare!"—a remark that deeply resonated with her. Soon after, Hart left her acting career, ended her engagement, and joined the Abbey of Regina Laudis in Connecticut, dedicating her life as a nun. Despite her spiritual journey, she returned to the spotlight in 2012, attending the Academy Awards when the documentary God Is the Bigger Elvis, which chronicled her remarkable story, earned an Oscar

### Did You Know?

- 1. Octopuses have three hearts and blue blood: Two of their hearts pump blood to the gills, while the third pumps it to the rest of the body. What makes this even more interesting is that their blood is blue, due to a copper-based molecule called MAKE YOUR OLD SOFA NEW hemocyanin, which is more efficient in colder and low-oxygen environments. When an octopus swims, the heart that pumps blood to the body actually stops, which is why these creatures get tired quickly when swimming. It's one of the many fascinating adaptations that make octopuses so unique!
- 2. The shortest war in history lasted just 38 to 45 minutes: The Anglo-Zanzibar War occurred on August 27, 1896, between the United Kingdom and the Sultanate of Zanzibar, After the death of the pro-British Sultan Hamad bin Thuwaini, a rival sultan, Khalid bin Barghash, took power without British approval. The British issued an ultimatum for Khalid to step down, which he refused, resulting in a bombardment of the palace and a quick surrender. It's one of those strange events in history that is often forgotten but truly remarkable in its brevity!
- 3. Honey never spoils: Archaeologists have discovered pots of honey in ancient Egyptian tombs that are still perfectly edible after thousands of years. Honey's long shelf life is due to its natural composition, which includes low moisture content and acidic pH that create an inhospitable environment for bacteria and microorganisms. It's a natural preservative, which is why it's been used in everything from ancient rituals to modern medicine for its healing properties.
- 4. Sea otters hold hands while they sleep to prevent drifting apart: Sea otters often sleep on their backs in the open ocean, and to keep from floating away in the current, they hold hands with other otters in their group. This behavior, known as "rafting," is incredibly adorable and practical. It helps them stay connected to one another and prevents them from drifting away while they rest. Additionally, otters sometimes wrap themselves in kelp to anchor themselves in place, making sure they stay close to their group even in the most turbulent waters.
- 5. The Eiffel Tower can grow taller during summer: Due to the thermal expansion of the metal, the Eiffel Tower can grow up to 6 inches taller during the hot summer months. The iron that makes up the tower expands when it heats up, causing the structure to elongate slightly. This means that the height of the Eiffel Tower can fluctuate depending on the temperature, which is Spring Word Scramble a surprising fact considering its iconic and seemingly solid presence in Paris.
- 6. There are more stars in the universe than grains of sand on all the Earth's beaches: Astronomers estimate that there are around 70 sextillion (that's 70 followed by 21 zeros) stars in the observable universe, far outnumbering the grains of sand on Earth's beaches, which is estimated to be around 7 quintillion (7 followed by 18 zeros). This mind-boggling fact highlights just how vast the universe is and how much we have yet to discover about it. Despite its size, the observable universe represents only a fraction of the total universe, making this number even more astonishing.
