Rock story: A young Canadian girl who loves collecting beautiful rocks nearly lost one of her favorites but managed to get it back. Georgia LeMasurier, from New Brunswick on the east coast of Canada, was traveling to British Columbia on the west coast to visit her grandmother. She was holding her cherished rock, as usual, but misplaced it during her flight. Unfortunately, by the time she and her family realized it was gone, the plane had already departed for London, England.
