But Kincraig local Carl Nagle saw exactly that. A monkey was eating nuts that had dropped from the birdfeeder along the fence. "The monkey seemed to know he wasn't supposed to be there," Nagle observed. The young male was found to have escaped from the Highland Wildlife Park, which houses 37 Japanese macaques, often called snow monkeys. Located in Cairngorms National Park in Kingussie, the park is operated by the Royal Zoological Society of Scotland.

Its history and intricate latticework make it a popular tourist destination. However, there is a miniature version of the Taj Mahal. At a cost of 20 million Indian rupees, he had the building built on their expansive property as a special gift for his wife. The house is occupied by a couple who welcome guests to shoot pictures on the property.

Did You Know?

- 1. Wombat poop is cube-shaped and scientists finally figured out why. These Australian marsupials produce nearly 100 cube-like droppings a day, and the shape helps prevent the poop from rolling away, marking territory more effectively. The cube form is created inside the intestines through a combination of muscular contractions and varied elasticity in the intestinal walls. This bizarre adaptation is entirely unique in the animal kingdom.
- 2. There's a planet where it rains iron. Scientists have discovered an exoplanet called WASP-76b, located about 640 light-years from Earth, where the temperatures reach over 2,400°C (4,350°F) on the dayside—hot enough to vaporize metals. On the cooler nightside, the vaporized iron condenses and falls as molten metal rain. It's one of the most extreme and alien weather systems ever observed in space.
- **3.** A species of jellyfish can technically live forever. Turritopsis dohrnii, also called the "immortal jellyfish," has the rare ability to revert its cells back to an earlier stage of life—a process called 2250 Bovaird Dr., Unit 205 transdifferentiation. If injured, sick, or aged, it can restart its life Tel: (905) 497.2525 cycle, potentially avoiding death from old age entirely. While it can still die from predators or disease, this natural reset button makes it a biological marvel.
 - **4.** Cleopatra lived closer in time to the invention of the iPhone than to the construction of the Great Pyramid of Giza. The Great Pyramid was completed around 2560 BCE, while Cleopatra reigned in the 1st century BCE. That's a gap of more than 2,000 years. In comparison, less than 2,100 years separate Cleopatra from today. This staggering fact puts ancient history into a whole new perspective.
 - 5. Trees can communicate with each other using underground fungal networks often referred to as the "Wood Wide Web." Through this system, trees exchange nutrients, send distress signals when under threat, and even support weaker trees by redirecting resources.
